

KADUNA

Kaduna State, in northwest Nigeria, has a population of 7.7 million. The state boasts a functional primary health facility in every ward. Immunisation coverage is 25% and antenatal visit attendance has improved from 30% in 2008 to 43.8% in 2017. Contraceptive prevalence rate is 24.10% while unmet need for family planning is 22%. (NUHRI/MICS 2017)

Key achievements

- To promote accountability, the State Logistic Management team was supported to track equipment donated by UK Department For International Development (DFID) in 5 selected LGAs
- Thirty (30) Programme officers from State Ministry of Health (SMoH) and Primary Health Management Agency (SPHCMA) were oriented and their capacity built on the new Annual Operation Plan (AOP) template
- Operational guideline for the State Contributory Health care Management Agency (KSCHMA) was developed with technical support from MNCH2

Transition and Sustainability

- The SMoH fully funded the MNCH week aimed at reaching women and children under 5 years with free Reproductive Maternal, Newborn and Child Health (RMNCH) services.
- The state received the first batch of payment from the federal government account through Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) to roll-out the Basic Health care Provision Fund (Fund) after meeting all the stipulated conditions.

- Support the validation of Kaduna State Contributory Health Management Authority Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) plan
- Follow up with the State to conduct the guarterly Data guality Assurance (DQA) across all the health facilities in the state
- Work closely with SMoH to support Basic Health Care Provision Fund (BHCPF)
- Provide technical support to the SMoH in cascading 2019 version of the Health Management Information System (HMIS) tools to the state and LGA teams
